Exodus 1

But the midwives feared God and did not do as the king of Egypt commanded them, but let the male children live.

One day, when Moses had grown up, he went out to his people and looked on their burdens, and he saw an Egyptian beating a Hebrew, *one of his people*.

“Who made you a prince and a judge over us? Do you mean to kill me as you killed the Egyptian?”

“I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob.” And Moses hid his face, for he was afraid to look at God.

Then God continued; “I have surely seen the misery of my people in Egypt. I have heard them crying out because of their slave drivers, and I am concerned about their suffering. I have come down to rescue them from Egypt and bring them to the land I have promised them... a land flowing with milk and honey.

Suppose I go to the Israelites and say to them, "The God of your fathers has sent me to you," and they ask me, "What is his name?" What shall I tell them?

You have made us a stench to Pharaoh and

“It seemed that the whole world, creation and everything, was coming undone, falling back into darkness. And emptiness. And nothingness.”

Then the Lord said to Moses, "Tell the Israelites to turn back and encamp near Pi Hahiroth, between Migdol and the sea. They are to encamp by the sea, directly opposite Baal Zephon. Pharaoh will think, 'The Israelites are wandering around the land...

...in confusion, hemmed in by the desert.
And I will harden Pharaoh's heart, and he will
pursue them. But I will gain glory for myself
through Pharaoh and all his army, and the
Egyptians will know that I am the Lord."

As Pharaoh approached, the Israelites looked up, and there were the Egyptians, marching after them. They were terrified and cried out to the Lord. They said to Moses, "Was it because there were no graves in Egypt that you brought us to the desert to die?"

What have you done to us by bringing us out to Egypt? Didn't we say to you in Egypt, 'Leave us alone; let us serve the Egyptians? It would have been better for us to serve the Egyptians than to die in the desert.'

Moses answered the people, “Do not be afraid. Stand firm and you will see the deliverance the Lord will bring you today. The Egyptians you see today you will never see again. The Lord will fight for you; you need only to be still.”

Israel saw the great power that the Lord used against the Egyptians, so the people feared the Lord, and they believed in the Lord and in his servant Moses.

Then Moses and the people of Israel sang this song to the Lord, saying, "I will sing to the Lord, for he has triumphed gloriously."
